

# Pollinator Profile: Flies

Some flies act just like bees, visiting sweet-smelling flowers. Others have more disgusting tastes.

They are attracted to flowers with **putrid odors**, **meat-like colors**, or **fur-like texture** that lure them in by pretending to be the **fresh dung or dead animal** that flies desire.

## Favorite Flowers

- ✓ **Flower Color:** Pale and dull to dark brown or purple; flecked with translucent patches
- ✓ **Nectar Guides:** Absent
- ✓ **Odor:** Putrid
- ✓ **Nectar:** Usually absent
- ✓ **Pollen:** Modest amount
- ✓ **Flower Shape:** Shallow; funnel-like or complex and trap-like

Flies frequently visit Dutchman's pipe, pawpaw, and some viburnums.
